RE: Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSA) Effective July 1, 2010

Dear Valued Customer,

The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSA) has a new roadability regulation that goes into effect July 1, 2010. This new regulation will require any motor carrier or driver of an Intermodal Equipment (IME) such as a chassis, to provide Young Brothers (YB), as the Intermodal Equipment Provider (IEP) with a Driver Vehicle Inspection Report (DVIR). The report describes the presence or absence of defects on the intermodal equipment being returned to Young Brothers. As the IEP, Young Brothers will be required to correct any defects to ensure the safety of the equipment before it releases the equipment to another motor carrier or driver.

Young Brothers has engaged eModal to assist with being compliant to meet the new roadability regulation. This is a web-based tool allows motor carriers and drivers to complete and submit their DVIRs electronically prior to returning a Young Brothers chassis to its facility. Please follow the steps below to register your drivers prior to July 1st. If you are already registered with eModal and have been assigned a PIN number, there is no need to re-register.

1. Go to www.eModal.com and click on the tab "Register."
You will be assigned a user name and PIN number which will serve as your signature.
2. Beginning July 1, go to www.chassisccheck.com to complete a DVIR.

The DVIR needs to be completed only when returning a YB chassis to our yard. The driver must make an inspection of the chassis components before the equipment is operated over the road. The DVIR must be filed electronically for all chassis returning regardless of whether a defect does or does not exist.

In most cases, the driver will be assigning a "duly designated representative" to file the DVIR report on his/her behalf. This representative must use the driver's PIN assigned above to file the report.
