1. **LOCATION** - Young Brothers, Limited, Learning Center @Piers 39 & 40. The main gate is located @Waiakamilo Road & Nimitz Highway. You will be directed where to park & to the Learning Center. Friendly reminders:
  - a. If you are driving onto the facility, you need a valid photo government issued driver's license (DL).
  - b. If you are a passenger or being dropped off, you need a valid government issued photo ID (State, Military, passport or DL).

### **TWIC**

TWIC stands for Transportation Worker Identification Credential. It is a common identification credential for all personnel requiring access to a secure area of MTSA (Maritime Transportation Security Act) regulated facilities & vessels, and, all mariners holding Coast Guard issued credentials. TSA (Transportation Security Administration) will issue a tamper-resistant “Smart Card” containing an individual’s biometric (fingerprint template) to allow for a positive link between the card itself and the individual. ### **MARSEC CARD**

Under 33 CFR 105.215, Security training for all other facility personnel. This section is in YB’s FSP or Facility Security Plan. This means that anyone that comes onto a YB facility more than once a week (twice a week or more) will need MARSEC (Maritime Security) training to include the following:

- Relevant provisions of the FSP
- The meaning & consequential requirements of the different MARSEC Levels
- Recognition & detection of dangerous substances & devices
- Recognition of characteristics & behavioral patterns of persons who are likely to threaten security
- Techniques used to circumvent security measures, and
- TWIC procedures

### **DRIVER’S LICENSE**

The driver/operator of a vehicle with a valid driver’s license will be allowed to drive onto the facility. A passenger can use any valid government issued photo ID, TWIC card, passport, driver’s license to access the facility.

### **Differences**

The TWIC card is an ID that a criminal/terrorist history background check will be conducted on the applicant to ensure that the applicant has not been convicted of a crime that will disqualify the applicant and/or on the terrorist watch list. A driver’s license check is not required and not part of the application process. And, no training is involved.

The MARSEC card is a card that tells Security personnel at access points to a regulated facility that the holder of the MARSEC card has had the required training under 33 CFR 105.215.

A driver’s license is a State (government issued) ID that tells Security personnel that the driver/operator of the vehicle can operate a vehicle on the facility or Federal, State and County roadways. And, it is a privilege to have a driver’s license, not a right. So, to drive onto a facility, the driver/operator of a vehicle must show a valid driver’s license.

***To All Our Valued Customers***

On July 1<sup>st</sup> of 2004, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has ordered the United States Coast Guard (USCG) to conduct unannounced inspections of all port facilities to ensure that all rules and regulations set forth in the Maritime Transportation Security Act (MTSA) of 2002, Section 109 and Chapter 33 Code of Federal Regulation (CFR) are being complied with.

One of the requirements that affect you as a valued customer is 33 CFR 105.215 Security Training for All Facility Personnel (MARSEC or Maritime Security training). This section states “All other facility personnel, including contractors, whether part-time, temporary or permanent, must have knowledge of, through training or equivalent job experience, in the following, as appropriate:

- Relevant provisions of the Facility Security Plan (FSP)
- The meaning & consequential requirements of the different MARSEC Levels
- Recognition & detection of dangerous substances & devices
- Recognition of characteristics & behavioral patterns of persons who are likely to threaten security
- Techniques used to circumvent security measures, and
- TWIC procedures

All customers entering any Young Brothers’ facility are required to have a valid photo driver’s license (if driving onto the facility) or a valid government photo ID card (if coming onto the facility). In addition to a valid picture ID, customers who enter the facility more than once a week must possess proof of MARSEC or Maritime Security training. The following companies provide MARSEC training:

We recommend that when you call these companies and inquire of their qualifications for teaching the course. Please receive your training in a timely manner because after July 30, 2005 failure to show proof of training means that access may be denied to our facilities.
